

Training cell for nurses in Haryana overseas placement bureau

THE Haryana government has decided to set up a training centre in the office of the Overseas Placement Bureau, Panchkula, to impart training to nurses. More than 50 applicants have qualified for training in the first batch of this institute, said Labour and Employment Minister A.C. Chaudhry.

Addressing a press conference here today, Chaudhry said the Overseas Placement Bureau had signed an MoU with Modi Healthcare Placement (I) Pvt Ltd, New Delhi, in view of the growing demand for nurses abroad. Under the MoU, Modi

EduCare unit of the firm would impart necessary training to the desirous applicants and place them in the USA.

Modi EduCare would provide training in general English, IELTS; computers and NCLEX. A fee of around Rs 90,000 would be charged.

Chaudhry said if the applicant is married, the spouse would also get a work permit as per his or her qualifications. For two children of the applicant, education up to high school would be provided free of cost in the USA. Chaudhry said the Bureau had received demands for 216 electricians, 24 crane operators, 48 iron workers, 24 instrument mechanics, 24 mill workers and 24 pipe workers for about 360 vacancies.
